ALUMNI NIGHT 1996

Alumni had our night on October 18th at the Colerain vs Western Hills football game. Alumni Band and Rhythmettes performed at half time. This was the tenth anniversary of performances by the Alumni Rhythmettes. One of the highlights of the evening was the Rhythmettes leading the crowd in the Macarena.

This year's special honorees were two groups of former Colerain athletes. The first group were former soccer players from 1924-1935. Before football started in 1936, men played soccer in the Fall. Colerain had outstanding teams and players. They won league championships in 1924 and 1925, and for eight straight years from 1928-1935. Games were played in the afternoon during school hours, and students were excused from class to attend. The original field was behind the old High School on Poole Road. Members of these teams honored at half time were John Eger '30, Ed Alfing '33, Charles Hoock '33, Herb Muehlenhard '33, Ray Rettig '33, Bob Muehlenhard '34, Harold Herrmann '35, Emerson Hoock '36, and Norman Muehlenhard '36

The second group honored were former women basketball players from 1924-1941. Women played basketball at Colerain starting in 1924. Since there were no reserve teams, the women's Varsity games were played before the men's Varsity games. Games during the 1920's were played in the second floor gym at the original High School, which was located at the corner of Poole and Springdale Roads. Today this school is Colerain Elementary. In the 1930's a new High School on Poole Road was built and games were moved to the newer and larger gym. Today this school is Colerain Middle School. Women's rules did not allow them to play full court. A team consisted of six players. Three played offense at one end of the court, while the other three played defense on the other end. The women won the 1940 County League Championship. In 1941 the State High School Athletic Association ruled that basketball was too strenuous for girls to play, and interscholastic play

was discontinued until the 1970's. The returning alumni honored were Katherine Meier Herrmann '33, Viola Herrmann Voegele '37, Ethel Wert Henderson '38, Ester Reckman Hasselbeck '38, Dorothy Wullenweber Nullmeier '40, Florence Muehlenhard Goetz '41, Irene Kramer Hammitt '41, Ruth Arnold Schiering '42, Mariam Mack Young '42, Irene Shealey Murphy '43, and Coach Lena Holmes Powers.

Quite a few alumni band members came out to "make music" with the Marching Cardinals. Alumni band coordinators would like to encourage all you musicians to dust off your instruments and join the good 'ole gang! You play with the current High School Band, so you don't have to worry about being a little rusty. Those participating this year had a great time: they were (Doris list the alumni band members.)

Alumni rhythmettes dazzled the crowd again this year with an always popular kick routine. This hard working group has a great deal of fun entertaining the fans with their half time dance routine. This years participants included (Doris list the alumni rhythmettes.)

Last, but not least, during half time two past graduates were honored into the HALL OF FAME. The 1996 inductees are: Mary Lee Meinerding Tracy '77. Mary was a 1977 graduate of Colerain. She has been coaching gymnastics for the last twenty years. Mary has coached six former members of the United States National Team. In addition she has coached American Gymnasts who have competed in the World Championships, Team World Championships, Pan American Games, and most recently the 1996 Summer Olympics. Her most memorable accomplishment has been coaching Amanda Borden and Jaycie Phelps on the 1996 United States Olympic Team, and helping win the Gold Medal for the United States. She has been Region V "Coach of the Year" five times, and USA Gymnastics "Women Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1995. Her Gymnasts placed first, second, and third on the Beam at the 1994 Elite Nationals and she qualified two athletes to the 1994 Team World Championships who won Silver Medals. Mary has a daughter Rachael Tracy.

Denny Hirsch '64. Mr.Hirsch was a 1964 graduate of Colerain High School. While attending Colerain, Mr.Hirsch was a honor roll student, President of Key Club, and a member of Varsity C Club. He also played basketball and baseball. Colerain's basketball teams in both his junior and senior years won league championships, and twice finished as district runner up. The 1963 team was the only Colerain Basketball team to go undefeated in regular season play posting an eighteen and

zero record.

In 1968 Denny graduated from Miami University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Social Studies, and he received his Masters Degree in History from Xavier University in 1973. Denny taught History and coached varsity basketball and baseball at Milford High School from 1968 thru 1977. After teaching Mr. Hirsch went into sales., and has won several sales awards for outstanding achievement as a pharmaceutical representative.

Denny and his wife Kathy have three children Tracy, Matt, and Scott. Tracy is a 1989 Colerain graduate, Matt a 1992 graduate, and hopefully Scott will be a 1998 graduate.

For the past ten years Denny has been very active in both the Colerain Alumni and Booster Associations. During this time he has served as both President and Vice President of both groups. Mr. Hirsch is proud that the Alumni Newsletter list has grown from 400 former graduates to its present size of over 14,000 Colerain Alumni. Over the last ten years the Alumni Association has given scholarships, recognized former teachers and administrators, and helped plan the annual Alumni Night activities.

Denny has also been very involved in Colerain Boosters. Mr. Hirsch notes that over the last ten years the Boosters have helped pay for numerous improvements for the school. Among these are band uniforms, gym floors, message boards, concession stands, weight rooms, fences, bleachers, and dugouts. The Boosters support many individual activity groups, pay for the athletic trainer, and give money to the athletic department for equipment, uniforms, officials, and transportation. Both groups support the students that attend Colerain High today.
