This fun night of dancing and gambling raises important money for our extracurricular programs at Colerain High School and Colerain

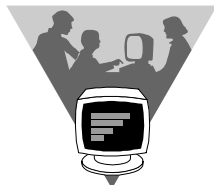

Last but not least, two alumni were recognized as Distinguished Graduates for 1998. They were **Norman Muehlenhard '36 and Larry McAfee '65**. While attending Colerain, Norm played in the band, started on the soccer team, and was active in 4H work. During the Second World War, Norm served

with the 84th Illinois and was on active duty for over four years. He entered the war as a private and, after a number of promotions, rose to the rank of Captain. Norm was involved in three major campaigns, including the Battle of the Bulge, and was awarded the Bronze Star for bravery under fire.

After the War he returned to Colerain Township. He served on the Committee to Establish Township Zoning in 1956, and was elected Township Trustee in 1958. Norm served as Trustee until 1976. While a Trustee, he served on the Hamilton County Executive Committee to Improve Local Government. Norm has been President of the Colerain Historical Society and Township Trustees; member of 84th Infantry Division of World War II, Colerain Township Republican Club, and Colerain Township Zoning Committee. He has been a lifetime member of the United Church of Christ and also belongs to Gailey Post VFW.

While at Colerain Larry McAfee '65 played on the football team. After High School he attended Ohio State University, where he received a degree in Economics. Larry graduated from Fort Benning Georgia's Officer School in 1968, was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, and assigned to Vietnam. While serving in Vietnam, Larry received the Bronze Star for bravery under fire. During his military career Larry rose to the rank of Colonel and served his country in Vietnam, Korea, and Germany. He commanded units of the First Calvary Division and the First Infantry Division, and from 1988 to 1990 commanded the famous Second Battalion 16th Infantry Rangers. Larry completed many military classes. Among these were Infantry Officer Advanced Course, Command and General Staff College, and Department of the Army Inspector Course. His Military Awards include the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, and the Combat Infantry Award. After retiring from active military service, Larry continued in a consultants role to the Department of Defense. His area of expertise was in war game simulations. In this capacity he reported to the Secretary of Defense in both the Bush and Clinton Administrations. Unfortunately, Larry passed away last year after a courageous battle against cancer.

Norm and Larry represent the many fine Colerain Alumni who have served their country and communities for many years. Congratulations Norm and Larry!

### **HISTORY OF CHS**

Colerain Centralized Township School opened in September 1924. In the April 26th, 1924 Hamilton Journal Newspaper there was an entire page given to the history of the many one and two room schools that had served the area. The following article about Barnesburg School was taken from the paper. In future editions we hope to also write the histories of Peach Grove, Cliptown, Groesbeck, Dunlap, Blue Rock, Dry Ridge, and Old Round Top Schools. **Editors note: The actual sentences and grammar are exactly as it appeared in the Hamilton Journal of April 26th, 1924.**

The building that served Barnesburg District as a school room over 80 years is still a good building. It was built on land belonging to the Barnes Family. It was a one room log structure and 76 years ago when J.J. Livingston was the teacher followed by Samuel Hammitt, the enrollment of the school was 100 pupils, the desks were without backs and were not fastened to the floor just benches of various sizes that might be easily moved around. On cold days the little children were allowed to sit nearest the stove, and when any were absent their benches were stacked in the corner to get the benefit of the space. When all were present the aisles were just about 2 feet wide.

Pupils from 4 to 24 attended some coming 6 miles. Mr. Agen, Abram Goady, and Royal Struble were also teachers in the old building. John Davis was one of the pupils of the old school who became a teacher. Mrs. Serepta Johnson attended this school 75 years ago. After this building did service for about 50 years as a school room, it was remodeled into a 5 room dwelling without enlarging it any, and sold to a Frenchmen who with his family made it there home for many years. Late he sold it to Mr. Oehler the general merchant. Mr. Oehler now uses it as one of his ware rooms and as stated in the beginning it is in sound condition.

35 years or ago or less the present two room school house was built. Some of the teachers serving an this building are James G. Keeling, J. Willey, Charles Mountville Flowers, George Hecht, Mr. Craig, John Hammitt, Estella Struble, Shirley Ryan, Minnie Kaup, Charles Kaup, Clara Wagner, Anna Weigle, Perry Brestel, and Mrs. Joyce. Miss Weigle and Mrs. Joyce are the present teachers.

Mrs. Ada Johnson, Miss Anna Weigle, Miss Amelia Heide, Minnie Kaup, and Jesse Van Ausdal are some of the pupils of this school who became teachers. William Johnson served overseas in the World War. Stanley Van Pelt is a prominent M.D..

These are only a "few of the many" from this school who are prominent. Helen and Blanche Craig attend Colerain High School and Hazel Johnson is attending Ohio State University in Columbus.
