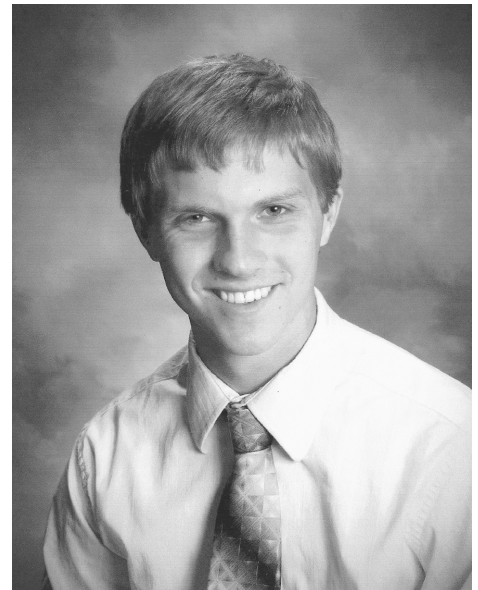

# UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Colerain High School senior, Brendan McDonough, son of Joe and Lori McDonough, has been offered the University of Cincinnati's Cincinnatus Presidential scholarship award. Brendan is ranked 6th in his class of 481 seniors. He plans to major in Communications at UC. Brendan is the first Colerain High School student to be awarded the University of Cincinnati's Cincinnatus Presidential Scholarship. The Cincinnatus Scholarship Program at the University of Cincinnati transforms the typical scholarship application process into a dynamic interactive event that celebrates student leadership, academic excellence, and personal growth. To be considered for this scholarship, incoming freshmen with a minimum 3.2 unweighted high school GPA must have a complete application for admission including transcript and official test scores - 10 Presidential awards of \$88,000 (est. \$22,000 per year covers full tuition, fees, room, board, and a book allowance) are given. Scholarship offers or invitations to compete were mailed to the highest achieving students in their selected academic program. Students were invited to compete on campus in February and were assessed on academic abilities, creative skills and leadership potential. Brendan's father Joe accompanied Brendan to his interview. Brendan states, "My dad says he was sitting in the lobby of the President's office, waiting for me to finish the interview, and when I came out of the office he says he felt more nervous than I seemed to be. He asked me how I felt and I said I felt like I did well, and he was the one breathing a sigh of relief. I think that shows how much he truly cares about me." Aptitude for community service is an important criterion for this scholarship, as service is a highly regarded value of the university and at the heart of the scholarship's namesake. Brendan's community service is extensive. Each summer, Brendan participates in a mission trip to help those in need. He has traveled to a variety of places and experienced a multitude of cultures and different ways to help, from working with Habitat for Humanity in Spartanburg, SC, to rebuilding a church on the Pima Indian Reservation in Arizona. This past summer he went to Philadelphia and worked with inner city services organizations to benefit the homeless that live there. That particular trip inspired him, so this past winter Brendan organized (and performed in) a coffeehouse/benefit concert at his church with local musicians and groups, where admission costs were canned goods and proceeds benefited the Freestore/Foodbank here in Cincinnati. Brendan is also an

Eagle Scout in Boy Scouts. One of the requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout is to plan and carry out a service project to benefit your local community. Brendan organized a landscaping renovation project for the building and grounds of Northwest Community Church, a project that totaled over 120 man hours. The day of competition also included vibrant speakers, a special luncheon and an informative program for parents. We look forward to hearing great things from and about Brendan in his future.

standards, I remind you it works. Their trips sell out a year in advance. It's not the marketing plan that's successful – it's the service! When packaging their tours, they demand quality hotels and great meals with only a passing consideration to price. They are more concerned about travelers being comfortable and happy, than they are about maximizing profit. Recently, Barbara told me she treats all her travelers as though they were guests in her home and not customers. In so doing, we develop friendship with people who happily introduce their friends to us. She said that when they started, "We had water and snacks on the bus and asked people to throw a quarter in the jar when they took something. But, it felt wrong. We never ask a guest in our home for a quarter. So we stopped it. Water and snacks are now available just as though you were sitting on our deck playing cards." The Eberts are a wonderful success story. Their business plan is held together by friendships, not paperclips. Their trips make money and their customers never complain about food or accommodations. Most of us operate with a rather complicated business plan, developed by smart people who do significant analysis and calculation and charge a lot of money. 


